Rev. Master's Europe Trip - 5th to 29th December 2007

On the 5th of December 2007, Master left Chennai for Brussels, Belgium, accompanied by thirty abhyasis. On arrival, Master showed all of us tolerance and patience as he waited at the hotel reception from 9.30AM to 12PM.

On 6th morning Master travelled to Paris, where a group of thousand abhyasis gathered to receive Him. Master stayed in a local abhyasi's apartment close to the Eiffel Tower as did Babuji when He visited Paris. He then drove directly to Vrads on 15th December, and stayed there for eleven days with nine hundred abhyasis from sixteen different countries. The atmosphere was festive throughout Master's Christmas visit to Vrads. The ground was white with frost. Many abhyasis accompanied Master to a nearby movie theatre to see 'The Golden Compass'. Master announced that He would be travelling to Cleveland, USA to celebrate Babuji's birthday.

After bidding a loving farewell to abhyasis in Vrads on the 26th, Master travelled to Bremen, a small town in northern Germany. In the evening to the delight of the abhyasis from Bremen and

other local centers, he spent time talking informally about many topics. On speaking from the heart, Master said, "Germans are truth lovers. My Master taught me to leave something where ever you go. And when I speak the truth, it will remain with you... Someday you may think about it. So we must speak from our heart to each other all the time... not only among ourselves but to every one we see."

On the morning of December 27th Master departed for Brussels and returned to Chennai on the 29th night. It was a moving experience for all abhyasis travelling with Master. It was a total expression of his heart, out of complete love for

the abhyasis with absolutely no concern for Himself. In essence he was urging us to use our hearts, to dare to think, speak our hearts to people and stand up for the right things.

New Year at Manapakkam, Chennai

Master arrived on Sunday the 30th December, 2007 from Brussels by around 2.15 AM at the Chennai International Terminal. There were more than 400 abhyasis waiting for Him. Master was looking quite fresh and spent considerable time in acknowledging the crowd of abhyasis who had gathered to see Him. Later He drove to the Babuji Memorial Ashram, where abhyasis had arrived in large numbers to be with Him to usher in the New Year. He once again spent time in acknowledging the loving reception which was given to Him.

In spite of His long flight and the late night arrival, Master was ready quite early in the morning and conducted the Sunday satsangh much to the delight of the 3,000 odd abhyasis who had assembled in the hall. Master was busy for the rest of the day as well as on 31st morning preparing prefects and attending to various administrative tasks. On 31st evening, he drove around the ashram in his golf cart.

On 1st January morning, Master conducted the satsangh with over 5,000 abhyasis present. In the evening, He spent some "quiet time" near Babuji Maharaj's statue outside His cottage. Overall, the abhyasis who had come to be with Rev. Master for the birth of the New Year 2008 had a special time, soaking in His love and the spiritual ambience that seems to have descended upon Manapakkam Ashram.

Youth Program at Babuji Memorial Ashram - 9th Batch

We are happy to announce the commencement of the 9th batch of the Youth program" from 1st April to 30th June 2008 at Babuji Memorial Ashram, Manapakkam, Chennai. The objective of the program is aimed at training the YOUTH of Sahaj Marg in the various aspects of running an Ashram.

Salient features of this programme:

- Intense training on all facets of maintaining an ashram and on Sahaj Marg during their stay.
- In-house stay at the ashram, at no cost to the abhyasi participants, during the programme period. Food and bachelor's dormitory accommodation will be provided at the ashram.

The following are eligible to apply for this programme:

- The abhyasi should have been practicing Sahaj Marg System of meditation for at least 2 years at the time of applying.
- Must have attended at least one or two bhandaras / celebrations.
- Must attach a certificate of Conduct from the respective Zone-in-Charge or Centre-in-Charge or Preceptor-in-Charge.
- Must not expect any other support, financial or otherwise (other than food & accommodation which will be provided free at Ashram) during the program tenure. They must carry enough clothing for their stay and some cash to cover their personal expenses.
- Must be highly disciplined and motivated to participate for the full tenure of the program. Participants who complete the program successfully will be eligible for absorption as Ashram Staff in Manapakkam and across Ashrams in India.

The medium of instruction will be English. Abhyasi brothers & sisters who are willing to apply for this program must route their applications through their respective ZIC / CIC / Preceptor-in-Charge. Short listed candidates will be intimated by email / post / phone after proper screening. The format of the application is provided in the following link

Training Program at Muzaffarpur




In the evening, an open house was organized. The open house attended by about thirty guests had discussions on the different aspects of Sahaj Marg and a question-answer session.

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Serve to Deserve





A two day training program was held in Mysore center on 3rd and 4th November 2007. The program aimed at conveying the message that 'Service' is the quickest and surest way to progress in spirituality and through service one can become deserving of His grace. Accordingly the following were the objectives of the training program:

- ∠To understand the need for service and appreciate various aspects associated with service.
- ∠To understand the existing serving opportunities in the Mission and the means of participating in them.

The program had about 125 participants from various centers namely Mysore, Hunsur, K. R. Nagar, Nanjangud, Kollegal, Hanur, Chamrajnagar and T. Narsipur. The training was facilitated by resource persons from Bangalore and Mysore.

The program on the first day commenced with the satsangh after which the participants were introduced to the objectives of the program. Following this, abhyasis were asked to

contemplate and discuss in groups on the need for team effort in work. Efforts were made to make the learning joyful through interactive games. This enabled the participants to appreciate the process involved in work, the importance of teamwork, the challenges faced and the means of overcoming the same.

On the second day, discussions were facilitated on various aspects associated with the service such as need for service, attitude of a volunteer, work ethics and role of the functionaries/prefects in supporting and nurturing volunteers. The discussions were followed by presentations from the representatives of each of the groups.

Later in the day, a quiz competition among abhyasis was held related to topic of Masters, Mission and method. This was followed by presentations on various types of Mission activities namely training programs, open houses, VBSE activities and full day programs. The program ended with the evening satsangh.

Children Centre, Bangalore

The Children's Center at Bangalore works with the objective of creating a harmonious atmosphere for children and providing assurance to parents that their children are in good care while they attend Sunday satsangh.

To ensure this a system of rotation of volunteers combined with a Coordinator for the Sunday was thought of and implemented. The rotation schedule is published for three months and coordinators are given a free hand in deciding, planning and preparing the activities based on their



experience and expertise. Emphasis has been laid on the importance of volunteers being a role model for the children.

This has worked very well with the positives being that the children are seeing a variety of activities every week such as storytelling, preparation of puppets and puppet shows, crafts, quizzes, acting, singing, reading, drawing, etc. The coordinators are bubbling with new ideas given that they would coordinate once in 8-10 weeks. They prepare ahead of time providing flexibility in rescheduling. Volunteers therefore are able to attend satsangh on a regular basis. It has reduced the danger of volunteers becoming attached to their work. Those who experienced the teething problems and solved it are more confident now and ready to take up the next level activities.

The harmonious atmosphere created combined with the effort put in by the volunteers has seen more number of parents providing a helping hand to volunteers and some parents stepping forward as volunteers. While the teething problems were many, the patience of volunteers including those from the Ashram office saw problems tackled immediately and changes were made to prevent these from occurring in future.

Gujarat Training Program

Every second weekend of the month has been fixed for conducting a training programme alternately in Hindi and Gujarati for abhyasis who have been practicing for more than two years. This programme is centrally conducted for the entire Gujarat Zone at Ahmedabad-Adalaj Ashram.

One of the main objectives, according to Master is to locate and recognize talent which can be groomed and shaped to become a real asset to the mission.

The recent programme conducted in Gujarati started at 8AM on Saturday and ended at 4PM on Sunday. A total of forty abhyasis participated. The planned activities were interactive in different ways and helped one to open up and feel free to share his/her views with all. Topics such as 'How I can involve myself in the growth of the centre' were very vibrantly discussed and inspiring views were expressed. Groups also presented skits on different spiritual values.

There was a session where individuals from groups had to speak on 'How they changed after meeting/ seeing Master for the first time'. One could distinctly feel Master's presence during these talks.

'How to Introduce Sahaj Marg to New Entrants' and 'Importance of Regularity in Sadhana' were among the many important topics the faculty spoke on to facilitate a better understanding of the Master, Mission and the method, quoting real life anecdotes which abhyasis were able to relate to.
