

Babuji Maharaj's 111th birth anniversary was celebrated in Tiruppur at the DJ Park from 29th April to 1st May, 2010. Around 9,000 abhyasis gathered on this occasion. On the 29th, Master conducted satsangh and then released many new publications. On the morning of the 30th, he conducted satsangh after which he read out three messages from Babuji Maharaj and then solemnised nine weddings. In the first message dated April 19, 2010 (Babuji's mahasamadhi day), Babuji says, "Everything works in our way towards this flowering of the soul in its aspiration for the Divine, the ultimate goal of its journey. They (abhyasis) are given the basic elements from the outset. It remains for our candidates to grow through their efforts and perseverance. "The second message received on April 29, 2010: "This gathering of faithful souls here below is touching. A true love song rises up to us. ....Beyond this birth anniversary celebration, it is the whole Mission that rises to the occasion. It attracts the Divine flow illuminating the hearts."

In the message received on the morning of the 30th, addressing Master specifically, Babuji says, "You are a leader of men, my son, a born organizer. This dimension gives you a special place in our Mission where you will keep an iconic stature for centuries to come. ... May tomorrow's world be united for the better in recognition of the unique power without which it would have been reduced to nothing a long time ago."

The divine flame should be kept burning by each of us by doing the daily sadhana. He recalled the days with Babuji Maharaj when they used to gather for bhandaras (spiritual gatherings) with hearts bursting with love and no expectations for spiritual growth. He said, "This is not a give and take situation. It is to put everything you have on the maidan (open field) in an effort to get everything that He can give you at his will and pleasure in his own time when he thinks you are fit for it."

"Sahaj Marg preaches simplicity of life. ... Each one of you in your individual life must strive to become simple, reduce your needs, simplify your wants remembering that Babuji Maharaj has assured us that our needs will be fulfilled, our wants are not relevant to the picture at all."

### **VBSE Worldwide**

VBSE has been one of Rev.Master's dreams. He wants values to spread and hopes that abhyasis all over the globe will practice such values as would help them improve their external behavior.

VBSE is picking up in some parts of the world, especially in Europe.

In Europe the work of VBSE was again reinforced in the halfyearly seminar for the coordinators of all countries and their teams. Most countries were represented in Paris the first week-end of May along with Dominique Descartes, Tilde a Troedni and Elizabeth Denley from Australia. It was a weekend full of inspiring presentations, sharing and lots of promise for future work, and also for introspection and a continuously deeper understanding of VBSE.

During the birthday celebrations of Babuji Maharaj in Vrads Sande, Denmark, there was a practical presentation, on the 9th Maxim along with a short presentation of VBSE. Around 85 adults participated.

UN Day of Families, the 15th of May, was held in many centers and ashram throughout Europe with VBSE activities.

The week-end 21st-23rd May is the national seminar in Italy with both a presentation on the VBSE activities supported by daily activities for 3 age groups of children.

In Germany, a program on "Animals are our friends" was conducted.

In Denmark, a program on "What is silence?" was conducted. Both children and adults participated.

UN's Day of Families: the 15th of May, was held in many centers and ashram throughout Europe with VBSE activities.

"VALUES, ATTITUDE AND THE 10 MAXIMS" have been conducted in Belgium, Denmark, Switzerland, UK, and Italy.

### **VBSE** India

A 3 day workshop for our abhyasis from the southern zones was conducted during the last week of April at Babuji Memorial Ashram, Chennai. About 75 abhyasis among whom there were more than a dozen teachers and 3 principals of schools attended the same with a lot of enthusiasm. The new syllabus which is being prepared by the LMOIS and SMRTI together was discussed and the participants were requested to give their ideas on the modules, assessment sheets for the students and the feedback forms prepared for parents. It was a very fruitful exercise and lots of inputs were given by the participants.

The syllabus is getting ready and it is hoped that the Primary School syllabus would be ready soon.

### Youth Abhyasi Program, Molena, GA

Our beloved Master said, "So it is not enough to have a youthful power behind what we are doing. It is necessary to have it guided, with wisdom, towards not merely desirable, not merely an achievable, but towards an evolutionary oriented goal of self-development." It was with this in mind that the first Youth Abhyasi Program was conducted at the Molena ashram from May 28 - 31, 2010.

The theme was *Living Sahaj Marg: Deepening our relationship with the Master, Method and Mission (the three M's).* A dedicated team of brothers and sisters carefully designed and facilitated the program, which included Betsy Barlow, Brian Jones, James Joseph and Veronica Carter. Eighteen abhyasis from North America attended this one of a kind intensive seminar. As the facilitators are all long-term abhyasis, they had a wealth of personal experience with the three M's to share with us. The overall approach was illuminating as it helped participants assess themselves. This fit perfectly with Master's description of "an evolutionary oriented goal of self development."



The atmosphere at the ashram helped us to better listen and perceive with our hearts, especially when reading from *Whispers from the Brighter World*. We were enlightened on Maxim 3, "*Fix up your goal, which should be 'complete oneness' with God. Rest not till the ideal is achieved.*" And we were given valuable tips to cultivate dynamism in our practice.

In a subtle way there was a change in our perception regarding self and the importance of a sincere attitude towards practice. When

reading excerpts from the Masters' diaries, we could relate to both the struggles and progress that they experienced on the path that we now walk. This in turn showed us the importance of observing one's condition and recording it in the diary.

### SPURRED to Write

I have found an oasis of sanity in a mad, mad world. SPURS retreat center in Austin, Texas has met and exceeded my prior expectations of spiritual benefit. Even though everyone I had met before my going there praised it to the skies, in this case the reality rose higher than expectation.

The specifics of the spiritual work and the experiences we are granted must be different for each individual abhyasi; as different as our unique samskaras and the path we chose to arrive at our current point of existence. However, the catalysts for those unique changes are the same: the charged spiritual atmosphere, the self-imposed seclusion from others at the retreat center, the very special sanctuary, the beautiful setting of flora and fauna (deer, turkeys, jack rabbits, squirrels, peacocks and multitudes of birds) which can be seen from the porch.

A thirty-five minute ride from the airport brought me right to the door of the retreat center. Immediately I was offered an individual sitting and given concise, comprehensive instructions covering all that I would need to know for my retreat - all lovingly presented by our caretaker brother and sister, Tom and Mary-Lou Stoner.

The first couple of days brought meditations plagued with thoughts; perhaps because of the lack of the formerly constant externally imposed prods to action, the mind spins out of control; whatever the reason, this passed, to be replaced by a serene experience of timeless being, followed by a significant shift in spiritual awareness, which must be unique for each individual on their unique path. After three days, I could start to read books, if I wanted to; I only read the 10 maxims; and I could do an hour of work each day to help with the upkeep of the retreat center.

The weather was gorgeous, though sometimes overcast, spiritually and materially; the climate reminded me of Bangalore, mild and warm. If you have the chance to go, act at once. Apply on-line, reserve transport, take leave from work and family, rush there, and relax in Him.

Arriving at SPURS this spring was like coming home after a long, long, weary trip. For weeks my heart had increasingly been filling with a sense of joy and anticipation at the thought of coming back. The spring flowers, which lined the drive and filled meadows with color suggested a sense of renewal; a perfect welcome.



The theme of the gathering was "The Role of the Master." Each reading explored

one or more aspects of the various roles that the Master plays in our spiritual evolution. These included **field preparation** (responding to the call of sincere hearts who might benefit from spiritual practice), **cleaning and purification** of the abhyasi, **transmission**, which makes possible the process of spiritual evolution without limits, **protector** of the abhyasis as they proceed on their spiritual journey, **spiritual guide**, helping and assisting them when they encounter difficulties and insurmountable obstacles on the path, and the role of the guru as a **connecting link to God**.



The program sessions included lively discussions about theme-related topics such as: What is a Master; Why do we need a Master; Fears and insecurities about having a spiritual Master; The importance of a Master's presence among us; Meeting the Master; How to develop/deepen your relationship with the Master; How does a Master-disciple relationship evolve over time; and Connecting with our own inner Master.

During one afternoon session, each abhyasi was asked to draw a short, theme-related reading out of a basket. We then listened to a talk from Master, entitled "Listening to Nature." Following this, we were directed to go out to spend time in nature to reflect on our own personal readings. Maui is lush and green, abounding in natural energy, so it is an excellent place to be in tune with nature. As we soon found out, it is also very conducive to meditation and reflection. Our quiet time in nature was followed by a very spontaneous session, as we shared our readings and many of the deep, meaningful insights that emerged from our reflection time.

As the weekend evolved, we realized the beauty of having such a small group size. It made possible a level of closeness and personal connection that is not always possible in larger gatherings. By the end of the weekend, we all felt a deep bond with the brothers and sisters of our intimate little group.

By Master's Grace, the weekend turned out to be highly successful. Powerful meditations, informative readings, and insightful reflection and sharing time all combined to provide the participants with a much better understanding and appreciation of the role of the Master in our spiritual evolution. And we all realized, at a very deep and grounded level, the need for this special spiritual connection with our beloved Master.

### Administration Team Update:

New ashram projects: the procurement of the two new ashrams (New Jersey and California) is moving forward quickly.

- 1. **New Jersey:** all requirements have now been fulfilled and our Beloved Master has asked us to proceed with the purchase of the property and its development as per the approved site plan. Completion of those renovations will be later this year.
- 2. California: the city planners have given their verbal approval to the development plan in preparation for a hearing before the municipal Planning Commission during the second week of June 2010. The Planning Commission is expected to give their approval, whereby the Mission will acquire the property by the end of June or early July 2010. Renovation of the building will begin after that with an estimated completion by the end of the year.

**Existing ashram projects:** Recently, Master has approved the maintenance budgets for the three existing ashrams and the long awaited building repairs and improvements can now begin at each of the sites. Abhyasi volunteers are urgently needed at the Dayton, Molena, and Sunderland locations to assist on the improvement work. # **United Nations News**

UN International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination Observed

March 21<sup>st</sup> was the United Nations International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination. Across North America, abhyasis and friends came together at local prayer events to commemorate the day with thoughtful discussions and heartfelt prayers.

Since March 21<sup>st</sup> was a Sunday, many of the events took place after Sunday satsangh at the local meditation venues. Such was the case in San Jose, California where about 100 abhyasis viewed a presentation of slides about the UN day and how our Mission complements the UN charter with the Universal Prayer. After the slide show, the abhyasis present sat for prayer-meditation for about ten minutes. Similarly, in Baltimore, Maryland about twelve adults and eight children participated in commemorating the UN day after Sunday satsangh. While the children were busy with games, adults discussed material from Revered Master's talks, focusing on human integration and togetherness to dispel discrimination of any kind in the world. In Toronto, Canada, the UN commemoration included recitation of a speech by Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. entitled, "Loving Your Enemies," as well as a slideshow presentation, and prayer-meditation for thirty minutes.



Organizing and participating in a UN prayer-event can have a profound impact. An abhyasi from the Midwest wrote of the experience: "The meditation itself knocked my socks off. It was very subtle and powerful at the same time. At one point I felt that there were about 50-100 people present meditating with us, instead of the 4 people who were there. The meditation brought me to tears. I feel that this event was planting a seed for other like-events at the same venue. It was full of purpose and the fact that it was poorly attended wasn't that important,

in a way, compared with the fact that it took place. It was our first event. We'll do it again."

Many other centers, also participated in commemorating the UN day on March 21<sup>st</sup>. The centers we heard from are: Caledonia, MI; Indianapolis, IN; Detroit, MI; Bowling Green, KY; Cleveland, OH; Seattle, WA; Portland, OR; Denver, CO; Phoenix, AZ, Arcata, CA, San Francisco, CA; Santa Cruz, CA, and Victoria, B.C.

# United Nations Days and SRCM – An Abhyasi's Perspective Shelly Gould Burgess

A few years ago when I first heard about the Mission's observance of United Nations Days, I was confused. I admit it. I didn't understand why we were doing them or what our involvement with the UN really meant. I meditated over my confusion, and, over time, a "big picture" emerged for me, and it's a very simple picture. Shri Ram Chandra Mission is associated with the United Nations because Master saw fit to create that official association. In order to maintain this association, we must participate in some activities annually that support the spirit of the United Nations charter.

The North American Mission participates in about a half dozen UN Days annually. A committee selects these from about sixty possible events. A center's observance of these events can be elaborate or simple, depending on what's appropriate for the center. Some centers have done fantastic, creative events involving art, entertainment, food, and exercise in addition to the Universal Prayer. Some centers simply meet and pray. Regardless of the approach, what is important is that we observe the events *somehow* and then report our activities to our UN Days committee members. The UN, in order to properly document SRCM's participation in the event and our association with them, require reports.

In terms of benefits, these United Nations Days provide a fantastic way to reach out to our communities. Here in America our culture can tend to be suspicious of a spiritual organization that has a guru. However, the United Nations is generally

considered a positive, upstanding global organization. When we reach out to our communities via our association with the United Nations, we may become a bit more legitimized in the eyes of a society that views the unfamiliar with apprehension. That's a good thing in terms of opening people's minds and hearts to the wonders of Sahaj Marg.

I also think that our association with the United Nations is an encouraging sign that our Master thinks we are becoming better tools for spiritual work. When Master re-introduced the Universal Prayer in 1989, it showed that we were becoming more capable of aiding in human evolution by participating in selfless prayer. Now Master has given us this new opportunity to conduct prayer events with larger communities, and I think it is a wonderful vote of confidence that we are becoming more effective tools. Finally, I'd like to share an experience I had with conducting an event on the United Nations Human Rights Day in December of 2008. I organized the event at a school and was excited for a big turnout. The hour of the event rolled around, though, and my excitement diminished as, with each passing minute, I began to realize that no one was coming. I decided to pray on my own. What followed was nothing short of remarkable. Of all the Universal Prayers I've prayed at 9 PM, never before and never since, have I had such a profound experience. I felt as if I heard a million voices praying with me. It was incredibly deep. It was then that I realized no matter how small or "unsuccessful" our attempts, the results are beyond what we can truly know.

# **Abhyasi Training Program**

In March, the Cleveland center hosted the first training session of presenters for the Abhyasi Training Program (ATP), a global initiative to be implemented in the U.S. and Canada. 

### Reality at Dawn



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
### Truth Eternal



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# Book of the Quarter: Heart to Heart Volume III



### Master's Journey to the Heart of the West

In the late 1980s and through the 1990s, Master toured extensively throughout Western countries. The six-volume *Heart to Heart* series chronicles his talks and discussions with abhyasis during those visits. The books feature many photos of Master with abhyasis, typically in casual settings. In those days, gatherings in the West were small.

*Heart to Heart Volume III* consists of Master's talks in France and the United States. In a public talk in France, Master reveals how the strong intellectual framework of Western experience has led to a divergence between religion and spirituality. He talks about the oneness of humanity and the illusion that one faction can excel technologically and materially while others suffer from want of basic needs; if one is dying all are dying. (p. 23)

His talks are framed by remembrance of his beloved, Babuji Maharaj, the memory of whose physical company at that time would have been fresh in Master's heart. In one talk, Master retells the touching story of his first meeting with Babuji, a story first related in *My Master*, but told in this volume from a new and poignant perspective that enhances the beautiful story.

The last few talks in the book were given in Georgia, U.S.A., where Master spent a couple of weeks with abhyasis near the future site of the Molena Ashram. In his address to the U.S. Annual Meeting, he urges Americans to keep appropriate humor and lightness in their work for the Mission which should not weigh us down with concerns but always remain what it is, a service organization whose services we must lovingly use and make available to others. (p. 243)

To read through this collection of speeches is to follow Master in his travels as he meets with brothers and sisters while nurturing the growth in an emerging Mission outside of India.
