Master's Report

Master in Chennai

In a discussion with abhyasis, Master said: "Our job is to instill a sense of urgency while at the same time remove the sense of fear. Usually fear is associated with anything urgent that needs to be done, but what we have to do in Sahaj Marg is to instill the sense of urgency but remove the sense of fear".

New Year Festivals

April 13 was the Tamil New Year, Master conducted satsangh. Everyone's focus was on their beloved Master. That individual connection with Master, an inner connection, was felt by everyone. Master conducted one marriage. Even though he was tired and exhausted, he still met with abhyasis who came to greet him in the cottage.

Saturday April 14 was 'Vishu', the New Year for the people of Kerala. About 150 abhyasis from Kerala came to be with Master. In the evening, Master sat outside the cottage and abhyasis came up to him in batches of ten. Master gave personal attention to everyone and then went inside to work. One could see many of these abhyasis were visibly touched.

Giving Him Space

On Monday April 16 Master gave a sitting and spoke to about five abhyasis from Morocco. All the abhyasis were in tears. One sister told him about the loss of a loved one and Master said, "One has to expand one's heart to envelope all. You see how many abhyasis come and go and they all have a place in Master's heart. When we love only a few, we feel the loss, if it happens. But, when the heart is open and it loves all, there is no loss."

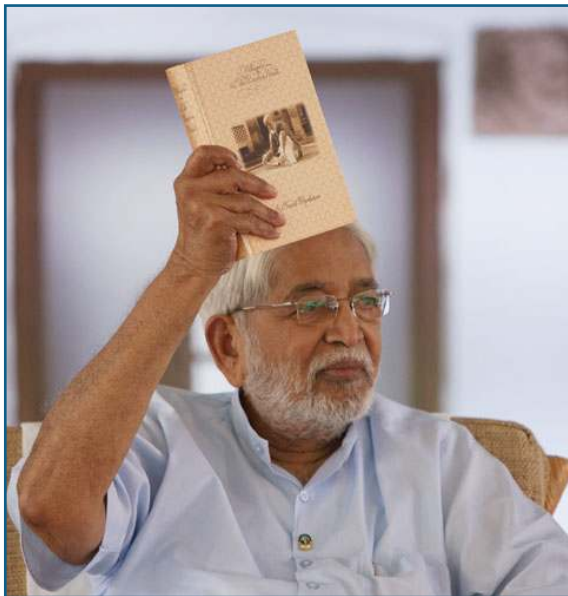
Master had expressed dissatisfaction that there were always too many people inside the cottage and they were demanding his attention, even though he had been trying to meet with everyone as much as he possibly could. Following this, Master decided to take a break and went to a place where he could rest. This location was kept confidential and gave Master his much needed rest and privacy. On April 27, Master came back to the cottage.

Babuji's Birth Anniversary Celebrations

On Sunday April 29, Master conducted the morning satsangh and performed eight marriages. Later, there was a working committee meeting held in the cottage. In the evening, a video call was set up with Br. Bhargav and Br. Kamlesh in Vrads Sande Ashram in Denmark and Master came to test the connection as he planned to address the abhyasis there, the next day.

Master was up early on 30th. The satsangh he conducted lasted for about 1 hour and 10 minutes. He then spoke and released the fourth volume of Whispers from The Brighter World along with an audio CD which has a few people narrating the Whispers in their voices. After releasing this, a few samples of these audio messages were played and Master again gave a short talk re-emphasizing the need to read the Whispers.

At 11 a.m., Br. Balasubramanian spoke and Master keenly listened to the talk from his office. It was a very impressive talk and it captivated Master as well as all abhyasis. He narrated several incidents from the lives of the Masters and urged us not to simply praise and flatter these great beings but learn from their lives and emulate the way they live.



As he was tired, Master had to cancel the video call planned for the European seminar. In the afternoon, he met with about five abhyasis from Romania. Master was expressing his concern that in Romania as well as in Russia, the western influence of an affluent culture is hurting the local culture.

While the evening satsangh was going on, Master went around the ashram in his golf cart. He stopped several times along the way to meet with children. There was a dance program by Sis. Soumya and her team and the delightful performance was a nice way to end the evening session.

Post Celebrations

On the evening of May 4th, Master went to the garden to oversee the transplantation of a large tree. A lot of preparatory work had already been done and several volunteers got together, lifted the tree and moved it to the new place. Master watched, guided all who were working and then watered the tree.

Master watched the TED presentation by an abhyasi in USA, Br. Trevor Weltman, titled 'Transforming Solitude'. He talked about how noisy our lives have become and how we can bring back the inner connection in our lives through the practice of meditation.

One evening, as Master was walking along the corridor from his bedroom to the office room, he met a sister and instinctively he reached out to a bag, took out a fruit and gave it to her. After she got the fruit, she told Master that she was pregnant and he just said, "Blessings".

Another night just before dinner, Master was talking

to an abhyasi who quoted a Tamil saying that "A tiger will not eat grass even if it is very hungry". Master elaborated saying that it is not ego or arrogance on the part of the tiger but it is its very nature and it simply obeys the laws of nature. So do the animal and plant kingdoms; they purely stick to their nature and do not compromise or deviate. Man is also supposed to be like this, that he should live by and display 'human qualities' which is his nature instead of displaying bestial (animal) qualities.



Seminar for Abhyasis from Bidar

On May 11th, Master went to the Allahabad Bank and then went to Dorm A to meet with around hundred abhyasis from Bidar. He spoke in Hindi and then gave a sitting to everyone assembled. He was not feeling well in the evening and had some breathing difficulty. It turned out that there was too much dust in the bank where he had gone in the morning and it had affected him.

On Sunday May 13, Master conducted satsangh after which Br. Chakrapani gave a short talk in Tamil and emphasized the fact that the human capacity to help others especially in moments of need and adversity is enormous, much more than the power and capacity of machines. With Master as our guide, we should use these hidden capacities within us to overcome all hurdles and reach our spiritual goal in the shortest time.

Master was talking a little about Russian and about learning languages. When an abhyasi said, "Master I am not able to apply myself to learn a new language because I do not see a purpose", Master said, "The purpose is that you will become proficient in that language, what other purpose do you want? Western culture has affected all of us very badly. For anything we do, we want to know what I will get. Even when I tell someone to start meditation, they ask what they will get. You don't get anything, but you become something. This same thing holds true in this case also."

Seminar for Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Hubli (N. Karnataka)

A group of abhyasis from Andaman and Nicobar islands and another group of abhyasis from Hubli were in the ashram for about a week from 15th May. Master was happy to know that about 100 abhyasis had come from Andaman and Nicobar Islands, even though it was expensive to make the journey, they had taken the effort to come for this seminar.

Master met these abhyasis on 18th. Br. Somakumar

"... So what makes distance in space and time unimportant is love. If you love somebody, you don't care where he or she is; you say, "He is always in my mind." So unless you get something in your mind, or heart as we say, we are subject to the demands of space and time, the limitations of space and time. So, whether you are an abhyasi or not, whether you are a rishi or not, if you don't love, there is distance."

18th May 2012, Chennai



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gave a talk and then Master gave a talk and a sitting. In the talk, he said "Distances of space and time become unimportant if there is love."

On May 19th Master had slept on one side and woke up with pain in his back. He had to be given some treatment to relieve the pain. In the evening, Master had planned to go to the new photo gallery that has been setup in the bookstore. After he went to the photo gallery, he went to his office room in the accounts area and stayed there for some time before coming back to the cottage.

After dinner, a young boy, around ten, was determined to meet Master and hand over a letter. He finally managed to meet Master who spent a good deal of time with him. The boy expressed his problem to Master and Master gave him some solution. It was interesting to see how Master addressed the concern of this boy to the fullest.

Civil Work in the Ashram

The tiles on the roof of the meditation hall have been removed, a fresh layer of concrete laid to repair the seepage of water. Volunteers from many centres have been coming during the weekends to help with this work. Regular satsanghs were shifted to the basement of the library block and Sunday satsangh was being conducted in the meditation hall.

Master conducted a full one hour satsangh on 20th May. In the afternoon, as the London ashram was getting inaugurated, Master had a video call with the abhyasis assembled in the London ashram. It was a

very short session but the abhyasis in London were thrilled to see Master.

In the evening, Master had a group photo taken with the abhyasis from Andaman and Nicobar islands. He had plans of going to the medical center after this but suddenly changed his mind and went back inside the cottage. He sat in the hall and gave a sitting to all. It was of course a pleasant surprise for all the abhyasis.

Master was in Gayatri from 21 - 26 May and abhyasis were asked to refrain from going there. Master came to ashram on 26th afternoon. In the evening, he was very busy with some abhyasis from Mumbai, discussing their ashram project.

Seminar for abhyasis from centres in Karnataka & Coimbatore

On 27th, Master conducted the satsangh for about 600 abhyasis who had come from various centers in Karnataka and Coimbatore and also a large number of abhyasis from Chennai and nearby centres. Later Master went to Dorm A and gave a speech to the assembled abhyasis. He mainly emphasized the topic of Love and said, "If we cannot love Him who loves all, how can we love all whom He loves". On the topic of abhyasis growth in terms of points and regions, etc., Master emphasized by pointing up, "If we are not there, we are nowhere", saying that we should not give emphasis on points and regions, but focus on reaching the final goal and not any intermediate steps.



Abhyasis from Goa

Master was again in Gayatri from 27 to 31 May. He came to ashram on 31st to meet with the abhyasis from Goa. He went at around 11 a.m. to Dorm A where only about twenty-five abhyasis were present and said that he had been hoping to see about 150 to 200 abhyasis. Master gave a speech and then conducted satsangh. In the speech, Master emphasized the fact that the Sahaj Marg practice is a very simple and effective practice and there should not be any problem explaining such a simple practice to everyone. After the satsangh, Master was visibly tired and went back slowly to his cottage.



After dinner, Master met with some Omega school alumni association members. Even though they were dealing with a very small fund, Master was particular on how they were to maintain records, expenses, receipts, etc. It was a lesson for all of us that no matter how small or big the endeavor, the effort should be the same.

Seminar for Omega Alumni

On June 1 Master inaugurated the conference hall above the library and also inaugurated the week long seminar for the Omega school children from the two batches that have passed out. He spoke to them and then gave them all a sitting. Master then left for Gayatri in the afternoon. He had planned to visit Hyderabad as the Kanha project was going very well and he wanted to do the registration work himself.

Eventually Master had to cancel his trip due to his health.

As he could not go to Hyderabad, he had invited the volunteers of the Kanha project to Gayatri on June 6th and had a long meeting with them and then gave them all gifts and congratulated them for making this project successful.

On Friday June 8 Master went to Br. M.D. Santhanagopalan's house to stay with him for about a week.

Master returned to the ashram on Thursday, 14th June. The next day he had to undergo some dental treatment and one could see he was in considerable pain and his face was swollen.

Seminar for Abhyasis from Lucknow

Around 650 abhyasis from Lucknow had gathered for a seminar. Br. Chakrapani spoke in Hindi, interweaving some lines from songs which carried the meaning of love and longing and conveyed the message in a very simple manner.

On Saturday Master gave a perfect sitting after which he was feeling unwell and could not meet the abhyasis from Lucknow as he had to rest. Br. Vinod Mishra gave a talk on "How to keep Master happy under all circumstances". Master was later talking about this topic and he emphasized the attitude of giving, that is, it must be given with an inner attitude of bhakti.

In the evening, Master had two meetings, one with children of the abhyasis from Lucknow and other centres and the next with the prefects from those centers. About eighty children and youth met Master and he gave them all chocolates and spoke to them. He then gave a sitting to about 17 prefects from Lucknow center.

Master conducted the morning satsangh on 17th. There was a large group of abhyasis from Chennai center, some nearby centers and also the large group from Lucknow which made the hall full.



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As Master had not been able to meet the abhyasis from Lucknow the previous day, he decided to meet them in Dorm A at 11 a.m. Master gave a talk in Hindi in which he emphasized the need and importance to do the right things in the present and not postpone for the future. He talked about the inevitable ageing process and how it is a fallacy to think that spirituality can be pursued when one gets old. He repeated Babuji's statement about wisdom, saying that it is wisdom to live as if we are going to die the next moment. After his speech, Master asked if he should give another sitting, as everyone had just attended satsangh in the morning. The abhyasis requested for a sitting. All the assembled abhyasis remained well disciplined throughout the session and sat in silence and gave Master the freedom to walk freely without crowding.

Master and His Work

Master watched a TED talk by Juan Enriquez titled "Will our kids be a different species?", a very intriguing and thought provoking talk. He listened very keenly and made a couple of observations about the evolution of the human being.

Master has been having pain in his right shoulder since a few weeks and patiently undergoes the prescribed exercises every day under the supervision of a physiotherapist. His normal activities continue under all circumstances. When informed that a number of proposals for new prefects had been kept pending because of his state of health, he asked for four of them to be called immediately.

Master spends time with children and communicates with them happily like one of them. A couple came to see him with a new born baby and asked for a name. Master thought for quite a bit and came up with 'Saraswathi'. He spoke to the baby and the baby responded and started smiling and laughing. An abhyasi asked him, "Do babies communicate with you, Master?". He replied, "No, they do not communicate, but when they recognise me, they smile". How many of us recognised the Master in him when we first met Him?

Youth Programmes



Panvel

Panvel ashram organized a camp for forty-five children in the age group of 13 -17 years from 20th to 22nd April. The topics chosen focussed on issues related to this age group. The camp started with a prayer session in which every child was asked to light a candle and say something about their concept of God. Groups named after eminent personalities and their most profound quality, were formed, for example, 'Mother Teresa - The Care Candles', 'Chariji, the Master - The Love Lamps', 'Abraham Lincoln - The Trust Torch' and so on. Each group was given an incomplete story which they had to complete and enact using puppets and masks.

Interactive sessions on topics like harmony, management, health & nutrition, energy & enthusiasm were conducted by professional abhyasis from their respective fields. A session of photography found children clicking amazing photographs in the green zone of the ashram. The treasure hunt was enjoyed by the children. Participants were given a copy of the group photograph as a memento.

Manapakkam, Chennai

A programme for youth of age group 17 to 30 years was organized at Manapakkam on 27th May on 'Be Simple and in Tune with Nature'. Around fifty youth participated beginning with a 'Nature Walk' around the ashram organized by a local NGO working for saving trees. Participants got acquainted with different trees in the ashram and came to know about their importance. A talk on the theme highlighting the importance of being simple was presented and Master's views on the same were also shared. A group reading and discussion on fourth maxim of Sahaj Marg was arranged. The programme was interactive, practical and useful.

Banashankari Ashram, Bangalore



In an ongoing effort to bring the youth of Bangalore together, informal sessions were started in January 2012. The sessions have been held once a month for two hours on a Sunday and the numbers are slowly but surely growing. The objective of these sessions has been to motivate this group to participate in the activities of the Mission as well as learn from each other in this journey towards the goal.

Topics were selected for each session not on the sadhana per se but on other aspects such as 'Why Am I in Sahaj Marg', 'What Am I?' and 'Being to Becoming'. In each session we also try to incorporate something new that can be learnt as in art, music, poetry, drama, etc. Apart from introspection and discussions on the topic, games and activities were included to bring in a feeling of fun and togetherness, helping the participants bond as a group. Every session also ends with Master's talk/video on the topic giving clarity and reinforcing the thoughts. More activities like a residential camp, visit to another nearby centre, producing a drama, photography contest, etc. have been planned for the coming months. We hope this group will grow under Master's guidance and that they will be able to deal with the pressures at college or work with support from their brothers and sisters.



Maharashtra

With the aim of refocusing the attention of the youth on the importance of spiritual practice, a two day programme was organized on 14th and 15th of April in Panvel ashram, Mumbai, where in about seventy eight abhyasis from Mumbai, Pune and Nasik participated. The theme of this seminar was 'Emulating His Ways' which had three sessions, to answer three questions namely 'What Should I do?', 'How should I behave?', 'How should I be from within?' wherein the topics on sadhana, character formation and attitude and change were covered. This was followed by an icebreaking activity on Ten Maxims. A facilitator briefed on the importance of voluntary work in the Mission. On the second day there was a question and answer session wherein a panel of experienced abhyasis, preceptors, functionaries and facilitators answered questions related to basics of sadhana, clarifications on daily practice, experiences, etc., which clarified lots of doubts of the youth. After a presentation on attitude and change, there were lots of fun activity. Br. Amol from Pune shared an animated 2D video clip on 'Meditation'. Some bhajans were followed by a presentation giving a glimpse of Sahaj Marg books.

Noida

The youth team of Noida centre planned various activities and events in the months of May and June for children in the age group of 6-11 years. The team organized biweekly summer classes for about 60 children. The classes included modules on 'Friendship', 'Sharing', 'Co-operation', 'Art of Listening' and so on. The team plans to organise classes for Std. VI to X soon and also plans to approach schools with the proposal of conducting spiritual value based classes.

Summer Camps for Children



Manapakkam, Chennai

120 children in the age group of 7 to 13 years came together from 7th - 9th May at Manapakkam. The first day had various activities, craft sessions and outdoor games on the theme 'Discipline in Love'. A value based movie was then screened for children.

'Simplicity and Sensitivity' was the theme for the second day. A craft session, an interactive and educative quiz session and a practical session of trying their hand at the potter's wheel kept the children active and busy.

The theme for the third day was 'Health and Harmony with Nature'. A documentary on 'Body Atlas', T-shirt painting, puppet show and treasure hunt were enjoyable sessions for all. An exhibition of goodies made during the camp was held. As an extension to the programme a 'Tree Walk' was organised the next day by a local NGO. Many children participated in this and got to know the different trees in the ashram. The feedback from children and parents was very positive and motivating.

Vadodara

A one day summer camp for children was organized by the Vadodara Centre, on May 26th, 2012, Saturday. The total number of participants were sixty. The programme comprised of slide shows on



Lalaji and Babuji Maharaj, songs, stories and games. The children benefitted from the different activities teaching moral values.

Panvel, Mumbai

Twenty children participated in a camp for children from 8 to 12 years from 25th-27th May. The children were divided into groups and given topics which they enacted on the third day of the camp. They made collages on 'Nature'. In the music session, they sang and learnt a song which was composed by a few amongst them. Sky gazing in the evening was liked by all. The children did some adventure by learning to climb down a wall using a rope with training from professionals. They played a number of group games involving team work, innovation and lots of fun. In the art and craft session, the children made colourful photo frames on which their group photo was pasted and given as a memento. A quiz on 'Energy' was also conducted. The entire ashram was engulfed with a special atmosphere nurturing the young innocent hearts.

Pilibhit

Children in the age group of 10-14 years gathered at Pilibhit centre to enthusiastically participate in the camp organized from 25th May to 3rd June with classes scheduled from 6:30 a.m. to 9:30 a.m. for ten days. There were fun-filled sessions full of laughter, inspiration and education. Various activities on moral and social values were followed by games, drawing and essay writing.

On the last day, an open house was organized for the parents and guardians. The participants expressed happiness about the visible improvement in their children's behavior post summer camp.

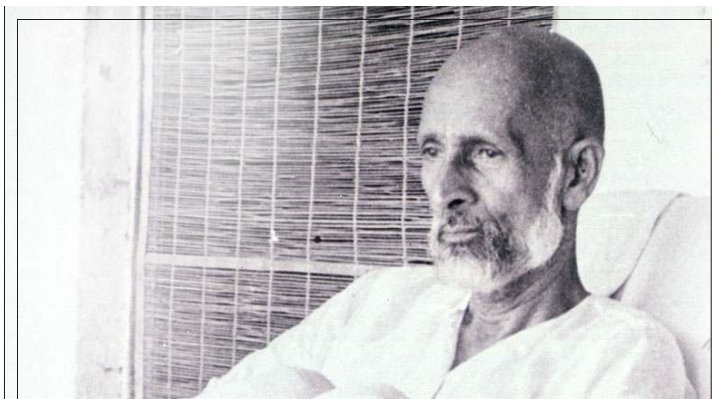

Pulgaon Ashram Inauguration

Master inaugurated the Pulgaon ashram in Maharashtra on 22nd April via video and then conducted satsangh for the abhyasis present in the ashram. A few abhyasis along with ZiC, Br. Vaidya were present at Manapakkam with Master.

Pulgaon ashram is small and beautiful with a total land area of 10494 sq.ft. The meditation hall of 2290 sq.ft. can accommodate around 300 abhyasis with facilities like a library, kitchen, service counter, wash room and toilets. More than 200 abhyasis from Pulgaon, Amravati, Wardha, Yeotmal, Chandrapur and Nagpur centres attended the programme. Master fills abhyasis' hearts with his love by giving everything that is needed for their spiritual progress.

Training Programmes

Jodhpur, Rajasthan

On June 3rd a workshop on 'Brotherhood' was conducted. All abhyasis enthusiastically and actively participated in the workshop with a prayer to become what Master wants us to become. After lunch, the plenary session was organized for self-introspection - what is more to be done on our part. To decide to change and to decide on what to change and then act upon change was the thought shared by every abhyasi. All abhyasis were of the opinion that we have to co-operate with Master by becoming obedient, disciplined by doing sincere sadhana and service. Love which is deep within each one of us should be directed only to Master. Master teaches by becoming an example and embodiment of what he expects from us. After evening satsangh, the session concluded with a prayer for a new beginning.



Training Programmes ...contd.

Shillong, Meghalaya

For the first time, a training programme was organized on 6th May in Shillong, for twelve abhyasis. The objective of the programme was to learn the method of meditation through reflection and observation. Audio-video clippings, presentations and activities and the video of Babuji titled 'I am telling you' made the participants feel the need for change in their current way of meditation.



Indore, Madhya Pradesh

About twenty abhyasis participated in the programme of 'Grounding in the Practice' for diary writing at Indore ashram on 26th May. The programme started with satsangh followed by a video presentation of Master. Abhyasis introspected about their habit and pattern of writing diaries and noted the points down. A presentation of Master's quotes was followed by group discussion. The programme concluded with Master's speech 'Naked Self' highlighting the importance of diary writing.

Uttar Pradesh

About thirty abhyasis participated in the programme of 'Grounding in the Practice' for diary writing and cleaning in Gorakhpur centre on 13th and 20th May. The participants were asked to read and then share their views as per the guidelines. During the second session, Master's speech was played and abhyasis were asked to answer few questions in their diary. Two modules of diary writing and cleaning have been covered and the programme has been started in Behraich and Balia centres too.



Planning Workshop, Mysore, Karnataka

A planning workshop was organized for district and center coordinators from various centres of South Karnataka zone on 19th and 20th May at Mysore ashram. The zone has thirteen coordinators and is supported by a team of help desk volunteers based in Bangalore. The workshop began with an ice breaking session where the participants introduced themselves. The zone-in-charge then gave an update on the zonal status. The participants formed groups to discuss the current situation of centres, key activities conducted in the last one year and the challenges that they faced. On the second day, soon after the satsangh, a video of Master on 'Duty and Responsibility' was played. The groups further discussed about the plans for the centres with respect to improving the quality and numbers of the abhyasis in the centres. The larger centres also discussed about the ashram maintenance related activities. The thrust was again given to have a heart based approach to the planning rather than a focus on targets. All participants opened up and were happy to have discovered newer insights and solutions for the common issues.

Godhra, Gujarat

Abhyasi Training Programme Level 1 was conducted as per the prescribed format of CREST, for thirteen newly joined abhyasis on 19th May at Godhra ashram. A few guests and relatives of abhyasis also attended the programme. The training was followed by a question and answer session. An introductory kit was presented to all new abhyasis and guests. This programme was very encouraging and an eye opener for the newly joined abhyasis of the Mission.



Ratlam Ashram, Madhya Pradesh

Centre of Light

Ratlam is one of the important districts of western Madhya Pradesh also known as the Malwa region. Ratlam city is the administrative headquarters of the district and also an important business centre. It takes less than twelve hours from Mumbai or Delhi to reach Ratlam by train. The nearest airport is Indore. It is also very well connected by road to the rest of Madhya Pradesh as well as to different parts of the bordering states of Gujarat and Rajasthan. Indore, Ujjain and Vadodara are centres of the Mission which are nearby.

The ashram is situated in Gram Barbad on State Highway 10 and is 6 kms. from the Ratlam railway station. The total area of the land is 14,500 sq. ft. A meditation hall of 1200 sq. ft. has been constructed and can accommodate approximately 100 abhyasis. Apart from this there is a kitchen and a well maintained garden.

The ashram is part of a residential colony where all the plots are owned by abhyasis. On behalf of the Mission, Br. Umashankar Bajpai completed the land related formalities. Master then granted permission to commence meditation in the newly constructed ashram from 27th June, 2010. At present Ratlam centre has around sixty-five abhyasis.

The Mission made its beginning here in 1993 with a couple of abhyasis. Prefects from neighboring centers like Indore and Ujjain used to support the center until the current prefect was appointed in April 2004. Individual sittings, Wednesday as well as Sunday satsanghs and celebrations used to take place at an abhyasi's house until Sunday satsangh moved to the newly bought ashram premise in 2010. The abhyasis had bought the land for the ashram in the year 2005.

Activities in the center include new abhyasi workshops, open houses, conducting of Essay Event in several schools and a 'welcome desk' which serves as an information point for seekers of spirituality. The center also supports the neighboring smaller centers like Khachrod, Jaora, Mandasaur, Neemuch, Khor (Vikram cement) and Banswara by hosting them for Sunday full day gatherings and other full day events.

Ratlam center abhyasis have not been fortunate to host a visit by Master and they all crave for that opportunity. Nevertheless, they cherish the well known fact that on his way to Raoti (a village 33 km from Ratlam), Revered Lalaji Maharaj visited Ratlam and stayed in the ashram of Baba Murakhdas located very close to the present ashram.
