

Throughout the month of March, we had several phone conversations with brothers and sisters from selected centres in the Region, about their activities and current concerns, as reported herein.

Burkina-Faso

Fortune smiled on us on 25th of March while calling Brother Siméon Nana, preceptor at Yaïka. It didn't take sev-

eral attempts to connect with him. We wanted to check whether Siméon had received the box of books and the cover mail sent out for the centre of Yaïka since March 5. Siméon had not yet received them, but we know from experience that it takes very often long time for a parcel to be delivered; thanks to Master all such boxes of books sent to other countries have been safely received. News from Yaïka are good according to Siméon, who had recently introduced three new abhyasis.



In Cameroon, as part of the impetus arisen from Lalaji's birthday celebration in Yaoundé, a special meeting took place during the weekend of February 2 to discuss issues related to the Yaoundé group. Following up on the main recommendation



of the meeting, our brothers and sisters are grappling to find a place to carry out the Yaoundé group activities. Steps are under way to secure the necessary resources to rent a suitable place.

Meditation premises

Since November 2007, the activities of the Abidjan centre take place in Treichville (in Rue 36 opposite the Nana Yamousso building). Contrary to the previous place located zaville. These visits fostered fruitful and

Congo

Questions and Answers

Is there any advice regarding diet?

Master says that vegetarian diet is best suited for spiritual sadhana. Meat, fish and eggs tend to create grossness or heaviness in our physical and mental system and, therefore, persons who are habituated to them are advised to avoid them. However, this need not deter spiritual aspirants from starting the sadhana. With regular practice of sadhana, they will be able to get rid of such attachments in a natural and relaxed way without forcing the mind, which would be against nature.

Liquor, according to our Master, creates a very gross form of intoxication in us whereas we are trying to attain an extremely subtle divine intoxication through spiritual sadhana. So, a serious abhyasi should free himself from such attachments with an effort of the will coupled with earnest prayers to the divine Master to strengthen his will.

What is the method of cleaning?

Close your eyes and start with the thought (no need to go on repeating it) that all impressions, impurities, grossness, darkness, etc., are leaving from behind your back in the form of smoke or vapour. Mentally assume that the sacred current of the Divine is entering your heart from the Master's heart into the vacuum created by the exit of impurities and grossness. After doing this for half-an-hour, you should feel mental lightness which is the proof of cleaning.

Suppose I miss the cleaning routine in the evening, what should I do?

It can be done in bed before the night prayer-meditation. If that too is not possible, then you should do cleaning for ten to fifteen minutes the next morning before you start your meditation.

Cultural Evening at CREST: Union of Hearts

The following write-up is the last of a series of three reports of December 2007 CREST session. The previous ones were published in December 2007 and January 2008.

Since my return from CREST, I have been humming the tune of songs learned hurriedly in the context of the evening program performed before Master by the participants to express their gratitude to him for the love he expressed by inviting us to CREST. Without our realizing it, this cultural event was one of the high points we experienced at CREST. We were lucky to have among us musicians and singers who suggested the idea of offering the performance to Master. A guitar was bought and rehearsal started immediately and went on every day during break time (between 1 to 2 p.m.). The suggestion to let everybody contribute in the play was accepted. Our musical instruments were limited to a guitar, a flute and an empty water carboy by way of a drum.

It was however necessary to find a scenario and a theme for the performance. It

was obvious: the journey of the soul in the form of a dialogue between God and the Soul. All along the journey, the dialogue between God and the Soul was interspersed



with poems, songs sung solo or in group, either in one's own language or in English, sometimes in chorus although nobody mastered the lyrics in all the languages.

We were lucky to be three Cameroonian in this session, speaking the same language. In our song, based on a national tune, we praised Chari whom we invited to come and live in our hearts.

It was a solemn evening; we were enthusiastic, frantic, and wanted simply to do our best. Every one was nicely dressed in colourful costumes of their own. This was better than same-colour outfits, thus symbolizing our diversity, the beauty of the performance, as colourful as a bunch of several flowers.

Master was majestically sitting among a limited audience; he seemed very happy and followed the show with a cheerful expression, laughing when God, with his deep, resounding, and imposing voice arising from nowhere answered the Soul.

This evening was the strongest bond between us all; the preparations enabled us to often be together, laughing, playing. We shared our ideas on the organization and the various lectures.

This performance was as beautiful as spontaneous; each poem, each song had a particular note, we felt the depth and intensity of each of them, because it was the heart singing. The show lasted less than one hour, it was very intense and for good reason, as we performed with such earnestness that at the end of the evening we all felt drained, we all had the feeling that we had expended all our energy.

The beautiful guitar was handed to Master as gift for CREST.

This cultural CREST evening was an expression of the union of the hearts!


The Region-In-Charge's Regional Tour
