Programmes at CREST, Bangalore

During this quarter, three events were conducted at CREST, Bangalore. Renovation work is under way at the facility. Scholars and faculty of the CREST visited educational institutions and other centers.

B.Ed. Teacher's Training Workshop 1 - 2 April 2017

This workshop was held at Panvel in Navi Mumbai. Topic was "Pursuit of Inner Self Excellence" (POISE) whose syllabus was prepared by CREST, Bangalore. Thirty-five teachers and observers participated. Mohandas Hegde, Rajeshwari Hegde and Bhavani Ranganathan from CREST anchored the program. Lalitha Rajagopalan and Meghana Pradhan coordinated from Mumbai.

Faculty Development Program

10 - 14 May 2017

This program was conducted at CREST, Bangalore.

Twenty-six delegates and four facilitators participated. Participants were divided into four groups namely *Purity, Devotion, Simplicity* and *Love.* Following talks were given by facilitators:

Services of Free Medical Centre at Manapakkam during the period from April 2017 to June 2017
