

# Love and Brotherhood Across The Cultural Divide by Gertrudes Sapitan, Philippines

29 days, 696 hours, 41760 minutes. These figures sum up the duration of the month that changed 30 lives forever. From 15th December 2010 to 12th January 2011, I was in South India as a participant of the 2010 -2011 International Scholarship Training Program (ISTP). For one whole month, I, along with 29 other scholars from 20 different countries, lived and breathed the principles of love, tolerance, discipline, prayer, and brotherhood.

We all came from different backgrounds, cultures, languages, continents, and belief systems. We all had our preconceived notions about people from certain countries, people we had never met. We all had our fears as lone representatives of our countries (more than half of us were the sole delegates). We all had our doubts, given the language barrier, among other things. However, as Master said, when there is love, we speak not with words, but with the language of the heart.

The sessions were a virtual United Nations assembly. Every so often, the interpreters would valiantly translate the words of the speakers, coordinators, and scholars for everyone's benefit. Outside the hallowed halls of the classroom, sporadic, informal language classes in Spanish, Russian, Korean, Japanese, Italian, French, Chinese,



and Filipino would ensue among us excited scholars. We were slowly bringing down the language and cultural divide. As the days passed, inhibitions were slowly eroded, friendships bloomed, and deeper understanding of the practice blossomed. Our looks and origins differed, but our hearts were one — they still are one. Each of us looked beyond our own idiosyncrasies; instead, we focused on what each of us could contribute towards the improvement of the other as an abhyasi, as a person. In becoming aware of our differences, we had discovered the similarities we had with each other.

In the hurried minutes of tea time, in between classes and late night insomnia attacks, we swapped stories about our lives in our native lands, dreams for ourselves and our own centres, jokes, and hours of bonding. In the midst of Natrampalli's cold breeze and Chennai's hustle and bustle, we grew in our faith, in our practice. Even in the occasional good-natured dig at one's language or accent, or innate *loony-ness*, we were all one in spirit. Disregarding the differences, the language, religion, sex, and culture, we were — and still are — aware that we were brothers and sisters.

We are all human beings. This experience opened our eyes, our hearts to what the world has to offer and to what we can offer to the world. All these things have changed us for the better. Forever we will remain grateful for the chance given to us to become scholars. Forever we will carry in our hearts the fact that we are all abhyasis cocooned in Master's unyielding love.

## Basics of Character at Kharagpur CREST by Balakrishnan Subramaniam, Malaysia

### **Pre-Seminar**

Hearing Master's speech on character formation, I realised the importance of a good character for spiritual evolution. The effect of the speeches heard and the books read are only momentary and I go back to my usual self and act the same. After awhile I feel bad and angry over my inadequacy of handling the situation even though I am equipped with the required knowledge. I begin blaming myself for not doing the cleaning properly and not leading a 'right' life. This had been going on for few months.

After one Satsangh a notice about seminars on 'character' conducted at Kharagpur CREST was read out. At that instant, I told myself that if I had the money I would attend the seminar and then promptly forgot about it. A few days later my son told me that he had a free ticket to any Air Asia destination and one only had to pay the Airport Tax of RM110. I immediately sent in my application for the seminar at Kharagpur!

As I was the first to reach, I received brothers arriving and made them comfortable in the dormitory, which is something that I would usually not do. I felt very friendly and cheerful and started to mingle with the other participants. Only when abhyasis asked how I felt did I realise, the magic was from the place and not me. The ideal character I wanted to be had manifested in me in Kharagpur!

### **The Seminar**

CREST is modern and it has a 'state of the art' library. The course material came from books and Master's speeches, which have been read or heard by me several times. They have been discussed during our seminars and extended sessions. But here, all pertinent qualities for character formation were spoken in detail. A saying of our Masters was given during group discussions. Participants then related a past incident with the given saying/topic and came up with remedies they would take in future to avoid such occurrences. A representative from each group related it during plenary/daily sessions. During these sessions, the participants were allowed to ask questions. By the end of the session the participants would try to understand the day's topic, absorb the knowledge and apply it in their daily lives.



Extra features were the readjustment technique in which we

meditated for about two minutes before starting an activity feeling Master's participation in the activity and in between or after an active activity, and the golden silence hour. The whole seminar was a joyful affair, brothers and sisters mixed freely and there was a sense of brotherhood in the atmosphere. The staff attended to our needs and carried out their duties without any resentment.

#### **Post Seminar**

The challenges faced during the seminar have taught me a few lessons. Agitation towards fellow abhyasis, irritation towards delays in trains and unhygienic condition of hotels have turned to my being cool and calm in these situations. I have learnt to not judge myself and others. I take few minutes to readjust myself when I feel the toll, then I bring my self to a meditative condition. I make an effort to live the Maxims daily.

#### The Environment at CREST

The environment is fully charged spiritually. One can feel the subtlety. I felt as though a heavy load had dropped off me. I felt confident that the possibility of reaching the goal is not difficult. The seminar and the environment contributed to such a feeling in me.

# China: A journey dedicated to our Master by Fabienne, France

Very often, life makes us take unexpected paths, I would not be able to explain why I participated in this adventure. But here I am after a year for the fourth time in China. Every journey brings me back inexorably to Xi'An in China, a place where more than any where else I feel carried away and filled up by my Master's love.
